In The Beginning.....by Joanna Reid

In 2017, I became a third-generation member of the Gold Coast Bridge Club. My grandmother, Nancy McKinlay, joined in 1967 and my mother, Heather Reid, in 1983. Both formidable players and great club members.

My first memories of bridge were as a child, when women wore pant suits and maxi dresses. In Grandma's smoke-filled living room on a Saturday afternoon, you could hear a pin drop as four taloned and bouffant haired competitors sat around a small table playing cards. I knew instinctively not to make a sound!

Nancy loved her club, the excitement of swanky bridge congresses at The Chevron and bridge cruises to exotic destinations. I thought she was fabulous.

My mother started playing club bridge in her 40s, when night bridge was still very popular. After retiring she became deeply involved in the running of the Club, acting as President and Diary

Manager. The colourful characters that played and the administrative machinations of the Club have been a huge part of her life.

No one at home wanted to hear too much about it all but she shared it with us anyway. Consequently, I've felt connected to this Club and bridge in general for decades longer than I've actually been playing. I've finally been sucked into the competitive club bridge vortex, with no hope of escape. Like my grandmother and mother before me, I'm well and truly hooked.
