## Arrive 20 minutes before start of play.

As a courtesy to our Directors, please make sure you *arrive at the club at least 20 minutes before the start of play.* This allows the director to correctly count the number of occupied tables and set up the movement for the session. If the movement setup is wrong, the whole scoring system and Bridge mates must be restarted, meaning a start delay (and later finish).

Similarly, *at the end of play* and just like us, our directors like to get home at a reasonable hour. After play finishes at your table, please tidy your table by pushing in your chairs, returning the table numbers and boards to the relevant area, and return the Bridge mates to the relevant crate.

# In the Beginning....Jim Moodie

Shelley and I moved with our two boys to the Gold Coast in August 1986 for me to take up the position of Deputy Principal at Benowa State School. Shelley recommenced teaching in primary schools in 1990 when both our boys were at school.

When we both retired at the end of 2007, we decided we would learn how to play bridge. In our early married life, we had enjoyed playing cards, such as canasta, 500, poker and cribbage. Two of our former school colleagues, Lynn Gerrard and Di Hodges, recommended we take lessons and join the GCBC as they were already members of the club which they enjoyed immensely.

In February 2008, we commenced our series of 8 lessons at the club. We missed the first lesson as we were on holiday but were ably taught the fundamentals of the game by Charlie Howard and two sessions of supervised play conducted by Kathy Johnson. We have found over the years that many of the excellent players in the club are happy to give advice about the game if asked.

With the fundamentals under our belt and with some trepidation, we commenced playing in the restricted section. We found the three and half hours of play quite exhausting when we first commenced but as time goes by you learn the ropes and you get in the swing of things. Some differences in those early days of play included no bridge mates. You had to fill in the "traveller" that accompanied each board with the score achieved at that table. When you reached the princely number of 50 master points, you moved from the restricted to the open section. During this time, we made many bridge friends enjoying their company at weekly bridge and on the special days organised at the club. We have never had a lot of goals for our bridge play other than enjoying the game, but we are quite proud of being on the Honour Board for winning our section in the club's Pairs Championship in 2019. We have taken the opportunity in our travels to play at other bridge clubs and very much like our own club, you are always made welcome.

As often expressed at the club there is always a need for volunteers. I spent several years reorganising and looking after the club's key register. Shelley and I have been the partner organisers at the club for the past 13 years which we have enjoyed doing, having the opportunity to talk to many club members and visitors seeking a partner. Always rewarding to find partners for new members to play with and get an introduction to our club. At the end of this year, we will be passing this position onto another club member.
